**DRAFT BILL No. 2,712 OF 2015
(From Mr. JEFFERSON CAMPOS)**

Amends Law no. 12,965, from April 23rd 2014, compelling Internet application providers to remove, by request of any interested party, references to information about him\her on the Internet, on the conditions set forth by it.

The National Congress declares:

Article 1. This law amends Law no. 12,965, from April 23rd 2014, which *“Establishes principles, guarantees, rights and duties for the use of the Internet in Brazil”* -- the Marco Civil da Internet (Brazilian Internet Civil Rights Framework), compelling Internet application providers to remove, by request of any interested party, references to information about him\her on the Internet, on the conditions set forth by it.

Article 2. To add item XIV to article 7 of Law no. 12,965, from April 23rd 2014, with the following wording:

*“Article 7
XIV - removal, by request of any interested party, of references to information about him\her in search engine’s sites, social networks or other sources of information on the Internet, provided there is no current public interest in the dissemination of the information and that the information does not reference to genuinely historical facts.”*

Article 3. This law is valid from the moment of its publishing.
